As you know our Mountain Activity Section is one of the Camping and Caravanning Club's Special Interest Sections. What seems to be less well known is what are the other Sections, how many Sections there are and that representatives from each of the Sections meet twice a year as a Forum. Deb and I are now our Section's reps and have just attended the latest Forum meeting.

There were two main themes this time. The new Data Protection legislation, on which more later as the Club develops its response to this, and Support and Development of the Sections.

Although many Sections, ourselves included in my judgement, are generally not just surviving but actually thriving, some Sections are finding it hard. Falling numbers and difficulty in filling essential posts are for some a real worry. The Forum has therefore been looking at what we are doing and yet might choose to do to promote ourselves and to persuade people who do come along that we are well worth joining.

Part of this process has been to look at what we each do and at how well we are conveying what we do to possible new members. What has emerged is that even among members of Special Interest Sections there is huge uncertainty about what each of us is offering. We shouldn't I fear be too surprised that there is still widespread uncertainty as to what we in MAS offer. Climbing mountains, or at least walking or scrambling up mountains still seems to be the perceived reason for our existence!

Amongst the Club's membership generally, there is reportedly even more widespread ignorance that Special Interest Sections even exist! Do members ever read Out and About in the magazine? Even if they do, do they ever get to the back of that section where all our meets are listed?

MAS is usually losing a few more members each year than we are gaining but not enough, we feel, to be unduly worried. Each of our Areas is still attracting new members and most who decide to give us a try, stay. Providing people with a good experience, and actually doing what they were told we do, is important and is clearly working. So, let's keep up the good work.

For your information there are 9 Special Interest Sections. How many can you name? You can cheat and look it up, of course, in Out and About! And when you can name them, how many have names that you think really give a clear and up-to-date idea of the activities they provide? Well, there's at least one that, by general consensus doesn't. Ours! Oper....

## Festival of Walking and Cycling 2017

Peakland Area hope to see as many MAS members as possible at this year's FoW&C which is being held over the weekend of the 27th of April to the 2nd of May in one of the most beautiful areas of the Derbyshire Peak District with excellent walking and cycling opportunities.

To try to tempt you to make the journey I would like to give you a brief insight into some of the places and attractions you may visit on your walks and cycle rides.

The meet is centred on Highfield Farm <u>Ashford in the Water</u>. Ashford is a very pretty, chocolate box village in the heart of the White Peak. It is home to the most photographed bridge in Britain which spans the crystal clear water of the River Wye. It is a tiny place made up of ancient, picturesque, cottages, two pubs, a beautiful church and a village store.

The cottages were originally owned by the Chatsworth Estate but were sold off in the 1950's to pay death duties. Some sold for as much as £50!

Ashford was once the centre of the local lead mining industry. However, the village is better known for another ore. Ashford marble is a unique limestone first discovered by Henry Watson in 1748. When polished this black marble provides a perfect background for mosaic and inlaid patterns. A wonderful example can be found in the village church.

Ashford was also the centre for a candle making industry. 'The Candle House' still stands in Greaves Lane on the site of the old factory.

With its long history of lead mining one of your walks must take you to the 'Magpie Mine'.

This is one of the most famous lead mines in the Peak District and is the only one with a significant part of the building still standing. The mine is at the junction of the Magpie, the Bole and the Butts veins and was only one of several mines trying to exploit this resource, The Red Soil mine was only a few hundred metres from the Magpie. This close proximity often led to disputes as the miners broke into each others workings. In 1833 this led to the deaths of 3 miners from the Red

Soil Mine who were suffocated underground when Magpie miners lit a fire to try to drive them out. Three miners were tried for murder but were acquitted. However, it was said that afterwards the Magpie was cursed and it never really prospered again. It finally closed in 1958.

One of the reasons why this is such a good walking and cycling area is that it is very close to the M1 of the Peak District, the **Monsal Trail**. This disused railway line provides a traffic free route through some of the Peak Districts most spectacular limestone dales. It runs for 8.5 mile from Chee Dale to Bakewell. Most of the route was opened in 1981 but four tunnels; The Headstone, Cressbrook, Litton and Chee Tor, had to remain closed for safety reasons. Now these tunnels are open to make one continuous trail. Many of our walks will make use of parts of the trail and you will find many magnificent views and interesting history along the way. Just a few of the notable sites will be:

**Litton Mill:** This textile mill was founded in 1782 using the waters of the River Wye to power a Richard Arkwright water frame. However, it seemed doomed from the start. It was in a very isolated position so that transport of raw materials in and finished goods out was difficult. The area was sparsely populated so workers were

hard to come by.

In 1811 there was fire which put the water wheel out of action for over a month and by 1815 the then owner Ellis Needham was declared bankrupt.

During Needham's time many of the workers were children and the mill had a very bad reputation for it's treatment of these young workers.

For a time the mill was operated by the Newtons who also owned the nearby Cressbrook Mill but it was destroyed by fire in 1874. It was rebuilt and in the following years changed owners several times never really prospering and eventually closed in the 1970's. It remained empty until being converted to

apartments in 2003.

Walking down a concessionary path from Litton Mill to Cressbrook Mill we will walk through the beautiful area of *Water-cum-Jolly.* Here a wide expanse of river is held back by a weir and a mill stream which used to operate a huge water wheel. Here the River Wye flows through a deep ravine with rocky limestone crags and cliffs which are now a popular

site for rock climbers.

Years ago the woods here were harvested for their Lily of the Valley which were transported and sold in Manchester market. Water-cum-Jolly is home to many birds such as Mallards, coot, moorhen, dab chick, little grebe and swans.

Walking over the weir on a fine footbridge takes you back to the Monsal Trail and eventually to **Monsal Head and the Headstone Viaduct.** 

The imposing viaduct was built by the Midland Railway in 1863 to take the railway across the River Wye and Monsal Dale. It is 300 feet long has five 50 foot span

arches, some forty feet high at the centre. Whilst today it is covered by a preservation order, when it was built it was seen as destroying the beauty of the dale. John Ruskin wrote:

'That valley where you might expect to catch sight of Pan, Apollo and the Muses is now deseasted in order that a Buxton fool may be able to find himself in Bakewell at the end of twelve minutes and vice versa'.

Across the A6 from Monsal Dale is one of my favourite dales, **Deep Dale.** 





This is a magnificent limestone dale now recognised as both a Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Special Area of Conservation. The dale sides are steeply sloping and are rich in wild flowers. In May you can expect to find early flowering purple orchids, cowslips, meadow saxifrage and spring cinquefoil. The dale is also home to a large number of butterfly species including green hairsteak, dingy skipper and dark green fritillary.

Other towns and villages you may visit could include the market town of **Bakewell** and the plague village of **Eyam.** For those who want a rest from walking and cycling during their stay there are plenty of places to visit all of which can be easily reached by car or even the excellent bus service that runs from the village. These include, to the north the spa town of **Buxton** and to the south **Matlock** and **Matlock Bath**, or why not take a ride on a steam train between **Rowsley** and Matlock?

I hope this has been enough to convince you that you can have a great weekend at this year's Festival of Walking and Cycling. We look forward to welcoming you to Ashford in the Water.
